Below are excerpts from several reflections on a Catholic perspective as we celebrate our 250th birthday for the United States.

Father Jeffrey Kirby, July 1, 2024 – [National Catholic Register](#)

Independence Day is an opportunity for every citizen, and especially Christian citizens, to pause and remind ourselves of some of the critical lessons at the heart of virtuous living and representative government.

Freedom is a fragile reality. The Christian faith and the American experiment assert that freedom is our inheritance as the children of God — and it's worth the risk. Of course, such an assertion requires that freedom be rightly and fully understood. Freedom is a summons placed within the heart of every human person to live a life of nobility, self-control and goodness. Freedom is not the power to do whatever we want. It is the power to do what is right and good. Freedom always runs the risk of captivity, however, either by our own fallen hearts through sin, or by structures of governance that repress authentic liberty, self-determination, and a creativity born from virtuous living.

St. Paul describes the struggle for freedom in our hearts:

"For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. ... For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'" (Galatians 5:1,13-14).

We are called to cooperate with God's grace, understand our dignity, and fight for the freedom to pursue and thrive in what is true, good and beautiful in our world today.

St. Paul also describes this battle in the midst of the world:

“Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers” (Romans 12:9-12).

St. John Paul II taught about this complementarity between freedom and moral goodness. In his encyclical *Veritatis Splendor*, the beloved Pontiff writes:

“Man’s genuine moral autonomy in no way means the rejection but rather the acceptance of the moral law, of God’s command: ‘The Lord God gave this command to the man ...’ (Genesis 2:16). Human freedom and God’s law meet and are called to intersect, in the sense of man’s free obedience to God and of God’s completely gratuitous benevolence towards man” (41).

The question of freedom and moral goodness are intertwined. We can discern this interconnection as human beings, made in God’s image and blessed with the gift of reason.

As Christians, we can also see the connection of freedom and moral goodness in the life of the Lord Jesus. He lived with perfect freedom and moral perfection. One did not diminish the other. Both freedom and moral goodness point to his divinity, majesty and all-holiness.

If we want the U.S. to grow and prosper and continue to be ‘the land of the free and the home of the brave,’ then a mature freedom and a sound moral sense must be fully retrieved and put into public practice.

“Endowed by Their Creator: Catholicism, the Declaration of Independence, and the American Experiment at 250” was the subject of a conference this month at The Catholic University of America (CUA) featuring a bevy of Catholic academics, jurists, and public intellectuals.

“It has been 250 years since a new people declared themselves to the world. At the time, less than 2% were Catholic, but the nation they built would come to serve as one of the proudest and most enduring testaments to the eternal truth of our faith,” Rubio, himself a Catholic, [stated](#).

Summing it up, Rubio said: “To look upon the history of this golden land is to see the face of God.”

‘Life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness’

The EPPC’s Ryan Anderson focused his remarks on the contemporary application in America of Catholic social teaching (CST).

“There are four fundamental basic principles of Catholic social thought,” Anderson said. “Human dignity, the common good, subsidiarity, solidarity.”

The [Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church](#) “talks about the ‘imago Dei’ ... so there’s a transcendent source of our dignity, but it also talks about a transcendent orientation. We’re all created for friendship with God. And so it’s both the origin and the end of the human person that explains the nature of humanity.”

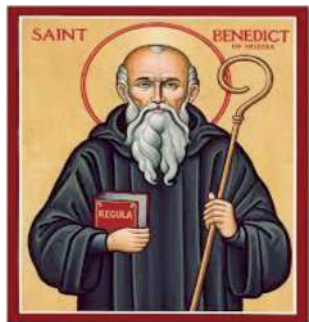
